DAY 1: ARRIVE IN DENVER AND TRAVEL TO SARATOGA FOR OVERNIGHT

Upon arrival at the airport, head [northwest to Saratoga](#), a magical place with natural hot springs and an abundant supply of cool, clear, crisp water filtered naturally and made into lovingly crafted batches of beer. [The Snowy Mountain Brewery](#) at Saratoga Hot Springs Resort is your first stop on this bucket list brewery tour.

DAY 2: SARATOGA TO CHEYENNE FOR OVERNIGHT

From Saratoga, travel along [Snowy Range Scenic Byway](#) en route to Cheyenne, with a stop for a local brew in [Laramie](#) at one of the three best beer spots in town: **Coal Creek TAP**, **Altitude Chophouse & Brewery** and **Library Sports Grille & Brewery**. With an ever-changing selection of beers, [Coal Creek TAP](#) has brews that pair nicely with their salty, hand-tied pretzel and honey-mustard-ale sauce.

[Altitude Chophouse & Brewery](#) offers a relaxed atmosphere, friendly service, an innovative menu and handcrafted beers. Or check out what's brewing at the [Library Sports Grille & Brewery](#) and sample their diverse array of beer, including the Apricot Mango Wheat and Steamboat Oats and Cream Stout.

From Laramie, head east to [Cheyenne](#) for a restful sleep at any one of the city's comfortable hotels. But first stop at [Danielmark's](#) to "Drink Awesome Beer, On The Frontier." After soaking up the outdoor patio, continue downtown to [Freedom's Edge Brewing Company](#) and enjoy some pints or flights before ending the night in the Historic Cheyenne Depot at [Accomplice Beer Company](#). As a bonus, Accomplice (as the locals call it) has a great menu that's perfect for ending a full day of travel.

DAY 3: CHEYENNE TO GILLETTE FOR OVERNIGHT

After soaking up Cheyenne's Old West spirit, travel north to Gillette with a not-to-be-missed stop at [Windy Peaks Brewery & Steakhouse](#) in [Wheatland](#). While there, take a bite out of some chicken-fried bacon, served with sweet and savory maple whiskey glaze. Continue 60 miles up the road to [Douglas](#), home of the jackalope and **Headstrong Brewery** (which also offers live music on Friday and Saturday nights).

After trying your luck at spotting a jackalope, continue north to [Gillette](#). Located downtown in the historic Gillette Post Office is Gillette's first micro-brewery, [Gillette Brewing Company & Gone Postal Pizzeria](#). This brewery serves up local history, as well as original craft beers, while it offers entertainment options that include pool tables, shuffle board and live music. After filling your belly on their freshly made pizza, continue down the street to [Big Lost Meadery & Brewery](#). While they also brew their own beer, be sure to try what made this place a distinct destination—their mead.



DAY 4: GILLETTE TO BUFFALO FOR OVERNIGHT

After soaking up history (and maybe even making a stop to tour the Durham Bison Ranch), continue to [Sheridan](#) before ending the night in Buffalo. In Sheridan, be sure to stop by [Black Tooth Brewing Co.](#) and try their most popular beer—Saddle Bronc Brown or Hot Streak IPA—before stopping into [Luminous Brewhouse](#) for amazing beer and live music.

From Sheridan, make the short drive south to [Buffalo](#), a town tucked away between the rolling plains of the northeast Wyoming and the towering peaks of the Bighorn Mountains. Check out MISHAP! Brewing Company, a small craft brewery located in historic downtown Buffalo. Turn in for the night with a stay at any one of the hotels, motels, guest ranches or mountain lodges available in one of the state's most charming towns.

DAY 5: BUFFALO TO CODY FOR OVERNIGHT

Fully rested from a night in Buffalo, travel southwest on the Cloud Peak Skyway Scenic Byway. Step in to a 7 BBL stainless brewhouse in a beautiful rural setting in [Ten Sleep](#) with a stop at [Ten Sleep Brewing Company](#). Producing high-quality craft beer in a variety of flavors and featuring an on-site taproom where visitors can view brewery operations (all while enjoying a pint), Ten Sleep is Wyoming's first brewery in a barn.



After soaking up Ten Sleep's charm, make your way to Cody to [Millstone Pizza Co. & Brewery](#). The menu includes burgers, specialty pizzas, oven-baked subs and 16 beers on tap. [Cody, Wyoming](#), was founded by Colonel William F. "Buffalo Bill" Cody, who at the age of 41 was one of the most famous men in the world. While in Cody, check out one of the many attractions this western town has to offer, including nightly rodeos, gun fights, cowboy music and the world-class Buffalo Bill Center of the West before heading to [Pat O'Hara Brewing Company](#) for some locally brewed beer and grub.

DAY 6: CODY TO LANDER FOR OVERNIGHT

Before heading south from Cody to Lander, make a stop at [WYOld West Brewing Company](#) in Powell to try some traditional brews, with a Wyoming spin, including the Kilted Cowboy, Honey Rye (made with local honey) and the Heart Mountain Hefeweizen.

Travel south to Lander and enjoy a brew made of the finest ingredients at the [Lander Brewing Co.](#) and be sure to stay for dinner next door at the Cowfish, one of Wyoming's best restaurants. Be sure to spend some time exploring some of [Lander's](#) many recreational opportunities, including hiking in Sinks Canyon State Park to fishing and climbing in the Wind River Mountain Range.

DAY 7: LANDER TO JACKSON FOR OVERNIGHT AND RETURN FLIGHT

Start the day off right and head west to Jackson and [Snake River Brewing](#), Wyoming's oldest, largest and most award-winning micro-brewery and brew pub. Nestled under the towering Teton Range and along the Snake River, "The Brewpub" is a two-time winner of the Small Brewery of the Year at the Great American Beer Festival and America's most award-winning micro-brewery since 1994. Don't pack your bags and head home before [Jackson](#) stepping foot in [Q Roadhouse & Brewing Co.](#), a bustling destination that has something for everyone, from a comfort food inspired menu that is perfectly complemented with craft beer brewed in house.

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
